Over the next 14 years, we will save at least on average \$90,850.00 annually. This savings includes all of the cost included in addressing the 19 projects throughout the school district.

The Lebanon School District has recently finalized the "Energy Conservation Program". This program will help reduce cost by replacing equipment that is more efficient, or by changing out equipment that is in need of repair or replacement that will also be more efficient.

This plan is very similar but on a much larger scale as to what many people do with their own homes. For example, you may have old wooden, single pane windows that allow heat and air conditioning to easily escape and they

do not properly open or close. An example in comparison to the school district, we have a boiler system at Donovan that has to be replaced and because of the age is no longer running efficiently.

Home Owner Economies - Window Panes

You have researched and found vinyl clad, double-pane, windows that will pay for themselves and save you money over time.

- You assess the cost of the windows and the installation.
- You also calculate the interest charged on the money you borrowed to pay for the installation and the windows.
- You know that in 8 years, the savings from a much lower energy bill will pay for the interest of the loan, the installation and the windows.
- You are also confident that you will continue to live in your home for the next 15 years.
- You realize that the money saved from years 9 through 15 is money that you can spend or save for other things you need to take care of.

School Economies - Boiler System

of money over time.

This is one way of **keeping** cost down and **reducing** the need to ask for additional dollars to operate the buildings throughout the school district.
