**Sheri (Johnson) McHenry** is a 1992 graduate of Lebanon High School. She was born and raised in the Lebanon community, attending Lebanon schools K-12. She is in her nineteenth year with the Lebanon City School district and currently is the Principal of Bowman Primary.

At Lebanon High School, Sheri was a member of the National Honor Society, on the Academic Honor Roll, a three year Varsity Cheerleader, and a member of several school organizations such as Future Teachers of America, Future Business Leaders of America, Yearbook, and French Club.
