Your child may start Kindergarten if he/she will be five years old on or before August 1, 2017. The law does not require your child to start Kindergarten unless your child is six years old on or before August 1, 2017. (You still have the option of holding-out a child with a summer birthday.)

Attendance at these registrations is essential in planning accurate student/teacher ratios. Anyone may pick up a packet, but a custodial parent or legal guardian must register the student.

Where Are They Now?

THOMAS SHOOP



Thomas Shoop is a 1981 Graduate of Lebanon High School. Shoop could be found competing in sports in those days as a member of the Football, Basketball and Baseball teams. Over the course of his four years at LHS he received six varsity letters. Most notably he was a senior on the 1980 State Runner-up Football Team and still knows the Warriors Fight Song.

After graduation he attended a small college in Kansas where he discovered a need for more structure and discipline and in 1983 joined the United States Army. He has served in all the Non-commissioned Officer Leadership positions from Squad Leader to Command Sergeant Major. He spent 17 of his 24 years in the Army on Fort Bragg, in North Carolina with the 82nd Airborne Division. Shoop Deployed numerous times during his service and had three Combat Deployments with the 82nd ABN Div. While serving he completed his degree in Business Administration and after serving as the Command Sergeant Major for the 2-505 Parachute Infantry Regiment he Retired with 24 years of service in 2007.

His retirement was short lived as he soon signed on as a Department of the Army Civilian. He is currently serving as the assistant to the Chairman of the Board for the Army Airborne Board. He facilitates unity of effort within the Airborne community by analyzing topics and issues under the Army format DOTMLPF-P framework, then provides recommendations to the Chairman in support of his roles and responsibilities as the Army lead for conventional static line airborne forces.

He has two sons. Blade, 24, is in his first year of teaching and coaching at Hoover High School Va. and Lance, 21, is a junior at UNC Charlotte in the ROTC Program studying Health Science. He still lives and works in the Ft. Bragg Area of North Carolina.
