# Cincinnati Nature Center

The Cincinnati Nature Center welcomes thousands of nature enthusiasts from around the region and beyond to explore the 1800 acres of forests, prairies, streams, ponds and wetlands that make up their two locations, Rowe Woods and Long Branch Farm & Trails. Visit the Rowe Woods location at 4949 Tealtown Road, Milford, OH. There you will also find The Cincinnati Nature Center's Nature PlayScape, which is intentionally designed to provide children with opportunities for unstructured play in a resilient version of local natural habitats. Native plants, fallen logs, boulders, rocks, water and soil create forest and field habitats for children to explore. The Nature Center's Nature PlayScape contains very few man-made structures (swings, slides, etc.) and strives to re-create the kind of childhood experience many parents and grandparents had in nature when they were young. The Nature PlayScape is located on 1.6 acres of forest, field, stream and wetland habitat within Rowe Woods. It is a short walk from the Visitor Center.
