The student will wear a face covering at all times, unless informed by a school employee that he or she can remove it. The student can choose not to remove his or her face covering. Plastic face shields not approved. The student will be informed when it is allowable to remove his or her face covering. These periods of time will include scheduled breaks outside, recess, lunch, and other times deemed allowable by a school employee. The student should expect to see cleaners, teachers, and other school personnel routinely cleaning and disinfecting spaces throughout the school, including classrooms, desks and chairs, restrooms, lunchroom and tables, and playground equipment. The student should expect to receive several opportunities to wash his or her hands and should do so. The student should expect to be reminded several times a day about face coverings, hand washing, and safe distancing. The student should expect to see a lot of signage reminding him or her about safety protocols. If the student feels ill at any point, he or she will inform a school employee (teacher, principal, counselor, lunchroom aide, nurse, etc.). The student will then be directed to the school nurse for assessment. If the student is assessed to have COVID symptoms, he or she will be guarantined in an area other than the clinic until a parent or guardian can pick the student up from school. The student will not return to class or be placed on a school bus. 4. <u>Lunch:</u> The student will be dismissed for lunch by the teacher. The student will travel to lunch, following all safety protocols of hallway travel. These include face coverings and safe distancing. Plastic face shields not approved. The student will be served his or her food. Self-serve food service is not permitted unless pre-packaged. The student will sit in his or her assigned lunchroom seat, remove face covering, and eat lunch. If the student needs to leave their lunchroom seat, they must wear his or her face covering. The student should see hand sanitizing stations in the lunchroom and use them. The student should expect to be reminded several times about safety protocols while eating. The student should expect to see a lot of signage in the lunchroom. The student should expect to see cleaners or other school personnel cleaning and disinfecting lunchroom tables and seats, as well as, common areas in the lunchroom. The student may be delayed or directed to another seating area if his or her assigned seating is being cleaned. If the student feels ill at any point, he or she will inform a school employee (teacher, principal, counselor, lunchroom aide, nurse, etc.). The student will then be directed to the school nurse for assessment. If the student is assessed to have COVID symptoms, he or she will be guarantined in an area other than the clinic until a parent or guardian can pick the student up from school. The student

will not return to class or be placed on a school bus.
